Be advised that any business that fails to renew its licence on time will be required to cease all business operations or will be subject to penalties (including criminal prosecution) under the *Business Licences Act 2017*. Late renewal fee is:

- (a) \$100 – in less than 30 days of expiry of the licence;
- (b) \$200 after the expiry of a licence.

Authorised officers of the Business Entities Section of the Department of Justice will be conducting regular on-site inspections of all businesses.

Business proprietors or licensees are advised to place their business licences in a conspicuous place on the business premises and must provide licences to the authorised officers on request.
